

Dear Parents and Carers,

As a school we have signed up to participate in the NSPCC Number Day on Friday 2nd February. This day will be a non-uniform day in school and we are asking the children to wear something numerical as part of their outfit for the day. This could be a number on the back of a sports top, a homemade badge, or any other creative idea they may have. During the day, the children will take part in some fun mathematical challenges to celebrate this special day. We will also be asking for a small donation to support the important work the NSPCC do in keeping children safe from harm and a payment option will be set up on Parent Pay if you wish to donate. Thank you.

A reminder about our expectations when children arrive at school in the morning. If, for any reason your child arrives late in the morning, and staff are no longer on 'Meet and Greet' duty, you must park up and walk with your children to the school office to sign them in.
