# Attendance and Punctuality

Regular school attendance and consistent punctuality is an integral factor of a child's educational outcomes and their life chances. Attending school regularly and arriving on time develops positive habits, not just towards school, but for employment later in life.

We understand that illness is unavoidable and there will be times where children need to be absent to recover. However, if your child's attendance drops below 95%, then this is a concern for us as a school. If your child's attendance drops below 90%, then they are classed as being persistently absent from school and we need to work with you to improve this.

On this note, a reminder that school starts at 8.45am in the morning and we expect all the children to arrive at school on time. It is important that they enter the classroom with their peers, so that they are part of the class's daily routines. If they arrive later than their peers, they miss vital instructions, they feel different and the children have also fed back that they feel embarrassed walking into a settled classroom.

Please know that if your child is ten minutes late every day, they will miss fifty minutes of learning time a week, which equates to one and a half weeks over a school year. Please note that when a child arrives late after the register closes this is recorded as an unauthorised absence for the whole morning session.

If there are any factors impacting on your child's attendance or punctuality, please do speak to us as we are here to support you and help in any way that we can.

## Parent Support Advisor (PSA)

Mrs Kim Muller, our Parent Support Advisor, has enjoyed working with a number of families during her first term in school. The feedback from those parents who have met, or spoken with her, has been very positive. There is now a PSA page on our school website that provides further details about the things you may want to talk to her about. The page also includes her contact details and you can access this by clicking <u>here</u>. Mrs Muller will continue to be in school every other Thursday for face-to-face meetings. Her first day in school this term is Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> January.

# Additional Funding for our School

We are keen to ensure that we are providing your child with the best education and support we can. Did you know that the school can receive  $\pounds$ 1,455 per pupil in additional funding to provide free hot meals, and to cover the cost of class trips, swimming and residential trips like Mill on the Brue, if families are in receipt of any of the following?

• Income Support

- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1st April 2018 your household income must be less than  $\pounds7,400$  a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Please let Mrs Wilbond or Mrs Coughlan know if you think your child is eligible; we will then help you complete a quick form. Please rest assured that all discussions will be handled both confidentially and sensitively.



# Winter Weather

As we are in the midst of winter, please make sure your child comes to school each day with a winter coat, hat and gloves. We will, weather permitting, ensure the children are outside for break and lunch times. If your child wears a vest, or an extra layer under their school uniform, please make sure that this is white, so that it matches the colour of their school t-shirt.

Very occasionally, schools are forced to close due to snowfall and bad weather. A decision to close school is not taken lightly and is made with the safety of the children, staff and wider school community in mind. If we ever need to close the school for safety reasons, a message will be sent out via eSchools, and the homepage of the school website will be updated, as soon as a decision can be made.
