Warmer Weather

Please make sure the children all have a refillable water bottle in school so they can keep hydrated. The children can also bring a sun hat in and wear sun cream to protect them from the sun rays. Please apply sun cream in the morning before school rather than sending the children in with their own supply. Thank you.



Towards the end of last term and at the beginning of this term, we have welcomed a number of new families to Sutton Veny. We know that everyone will all make them feel really welcome and we hope that they will all be very happy being part of our school community.



At the end of last term, Miss Elle Berrington, our sports coach who has been working in school, left to go on maternity leave and we wish her and her family all the best in the coming weeks.

This term, we welcome Mrs Mollie Williams, who has worked at the school before, back to Sutton Veny. We are delighted that she is returning to teach part of our Wednesday Enrichment programme and she is looking forward to working with Auckland Class during Term 6.



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Attendance and Term Time Holidays

As a school, we are unable to authorise any absence unless under exceptional circumstances. Our procedure for requesting absence in school is for you to contact the school office and complete the relevant 'request for absence' form. This will then be returned to you and you will be informed whether or not your request has been authorised. The response may include information about the consequences of taking unauthorised absence from school, especially if you take a term time holiday that means your child(ren) will be absent from school for five school days or more.

We encourage you to be open and honest with us about your reasons for absence, because the children always are when they return to school. If you have provided us with a reason for your child's absence and on return to school your child(ren) tell us otherwise, we will contact you to clarify the reason for their absence.



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School Traffic and Parking

As a school, we always encourage safe and considerate travel to and from school. We are aware of how busy the village can get at dropoff and pick-up times, but the safety of the children is paramount, particularly for those families who walk to and from school. Here are some important reminders to ensure the village is as safe as it can be during these times:

- Park considerably avoid narrow areas of the village and residents' driveways.
- Keep the left had side of the road leading up to school clear — avoid parking between Bests Lane and the school car park.
- The school car park is for staff, taxis and emergency vehicles only.
- Think 20! Keep you speed to 20 miles an hour when driving to and from school.

If you, or any members of the school, or village community, have genuine safety concerns about unsafe, or inconsiderate road use, they will be encouraged to report this to the relevant authorities.

A reminder that the popular Warminster Bus service picks up from several locations around town each morning and takes the children back to Warminster for approximately 4.00pm. Using the service helps to reduce the number of cars in the village and reduces our school's carbon footprint too.

Compass Schools Collaboration

Throughout this academic year, Sutton Veny School has continued working in a local collaboration with five other schools, known as the Compass School Group. We have been supported in this work by the Local Authority and the whole experience has been very positive for all the schools involved. Working closely together has provided us with a different platform for school improvement. Staff across the schools have engaged in shared professional development opportunities; we have provided opportunities for the children, with school councils working together, as well as shared sporting events between the schools and community events for the children to take part in. It has also allowed us to save money, by sharing the cost of services and transport.

We are extremely pleased with the impact the collaboration has had across our schools and we look forward to continuing our work and strengthening our partnership together.

Mill on the Brue Residential Meeting


